SERVICE DIRECTOR REPORT

Steven Tyminski, Service Director gave the July update. Steven was congratulated as this was his first official meeting as Service Director.

Jackson Construction started on the curbing work.

The salt bid from Compass was received and came in at \$65.40 per ton. There is no minimum or maximum we have to purchase.

A lady will be working/volunteering in cemeteries to clean Veterans headstones. The Township will purchase some cleaning solution for her.

The Service Department helped with the Clermont County Sheriff's Office's National Night Out. It was a great success.

Field 4 of the baseball fields has an issue with drainage.

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Denise Kelley gave the July 2021 report. There was a total of 25 single family home permits, 6 permits were in Rosewood. Billingsley single family had 16 sold.

The BZA met and had 3 cases in July. There will be one application in August.

The Zoning Commission did not meet in July and will not in August but will meet in September.

Denise, Adele, and Jonathan will have a preapplication meeting about a zone change for Carl Hartman and Ketan Patel.

TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Adele Evans gave the Amelia update. Craig Lytle is working on an auction for the Amelia items. It was recommended to have a community preview day. All items will still be on the internet auction. There is an inventory list that will be completed by Craig Lytle. Some items will be made available for donation to other Townships. Adele will send an email to other townships about their interest in the office furniture. Once the buildings are empty they can be marketed to be sold. Duke Energy was able to transfer the SR125 traffic signals to ODOT. The village Admin building bill will be sent to Batavia Township and we will pay the 35% and be reimbursed from Pierce Township for the 65%. No village council meeting has been scheduled.

The K-9 Memorial is still progressing on being moved to the township park. When there is a K-9 funeral, there is plenty of parking at Batavia Township for the funeral. The Memorial Group conducts an annual 5K run as a fundraiser and beginning next year will be held at the township park.

The display cases to preserve the Amelia items (pictures, plaques, etc.) located at Batavia Township turned out great. Rex was thanked for this idea.

Now that there is a gate at the cemetery, a new cemetery sign will be ordered.

The restroom and sanitary sewer project bids are set to be open next Wednesday.

Jennifer and Adele have all the required information for the American Rescue Fund. We have until 2024 to decide the best use for those funds. The funds will be released into two payments, one year apart.

Adele is still waiting for the subrecipient grant for the CDBG projects. The County will reimburse us for the costs. The county is now planning on paying 100% of the cost of the Chapel Road sidewalk. That project is already designed. We will enter into the agreement with Choice One for bidding and construction inspection.

Back The Heroes Car Show is this Saturday, August 7, 2021. Approximately 400 cars are expected to show. They would like to grow this into a two-day event.

The legal holidays for 2022 were discussed. Per the ORC, townships must now recognize Juneteenth as a Federal and State legal paid holiday. If it falls on a week end it will be recognized on a Friday or Monday. We will have discussion in December during our calendar planning for next year. Adele will follow-up with other townships on how they are handling this additional holiday.

Duke Energy is moving forward with the preferred route for the Duke pipeline, and construction should start in 2022 and be completed in 2023.

LAW ENFORCEMENT MONTHLY REPORT

Deputy Jesse Kidder gave the Batavia Township crime report for the month of July. There were 174 offense reports, a 14% decrease from June. The highest crime type report was theft offenses. For the Batavia Township Deputy activity: There were 46 adult arrests and 6 juvenile arrests. There were 123 warrant services and attempts. There were 352 civil paper services. There were 11 traffic citations and 82 warnings. There were 132 business checks in the Township. They assisted outside agencies 20 times. There was a total of 523 calls for service in July. Of the 174 offense reports taken, 121 were taken by the contract Deputies. Of the 283 incident reports, they handled 216. Recovered stolen property totaled \$25,479.00. There has been a large amount of vehicle break-ins. There were four overdoses reported and four burglaries in Batavia Township. There was only one breaking and entering reported.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Jennifer gave an update on Central Joint Fire & EMS District. There were 293 EMS runs, 275 patient transports, and 119 fire runs. There was an update on the Delta variant. They expect it to peak in October. Jason Hardyman has the highest score to be appointed Captain. The open lieutenant spot will be posted next week.

Mr. Parsons gave the report for Batavia-Union Cemetery. Towne Properties is no longer mowing for the Township. Today the mowing contract was awarded to A&A mowing. They will finish this year. Donna Amann, member-at-large no longer wishes to serve. We are looking for a replacement. A special joint meeting with the Village will need to be scheduled to appoint a new member.

OLD BUSINESS

No trucks were available on the state bid for 2021. Will look at 2022 State bid list in January/February 2022.
